

DNA TESTING



DNA Testing Matters

The Lakeshore Humane Society serves as a temporary home to many dogs while we work on finding them a new forever home. With ASPCA approved behavior modifications for all of our canine residents to one on one counseling with an educated staff and volunteer base, we invest time love and compassion into all of our dogs and potential new owners.

At the Lakeshore Humane Society, we work to educate and do not discriminate against breeds; however our shelter software requires that we input breed specifics. Often times wonderful dogs are overlooked due to the type of breed that we have to guess that they are.

Always striving for the better, we no longer wished to classify our dogs at the status quo of visual identification. Through the crowdfunding* site loveanimals.org along with monetary donations from people that share our vision, we created a fundraising platform to DNA test all of the mixed breed dogs that enter our shelter doors. On April 28th, our project was completely funded and we were able to purchase 12 Wisdom Panel DNA kits. With accurate breed identification, we have another tool to get some of our longer unknown breed residents help to find their forever home. DNA testing on many of our mixed breed dogs began on May 18th. Stay tuned for updates on this important project!

***Crowdfunding is the practice of funding a project or venture by raising many small amounts of money from a large number of people typically via the internet.**

PUBLIC OUTREACH

Please take a few moments now and ask yourself: "Does fostering an animal fit my household and my life?"

Fostering a shelter pet is a 24/7 job. Although you may not be physically interacting with the animal every second of the day, you will be responsible round the clock for the pet's safety, comfort, and general well-being, and this responsibility can be exhausting.

The amount of personal attention needed will vary greatly from animal to animal, but you can expect to spend anywhere from three to seven hours a day interacting with a foster pet, and even more if you're planning to foster puppies or kittens.

You may also want to ask yourself: "Am I prepared to say goodbye?" Some foster animals may be with their foster families for days, even months, before they are ready to return to the shelter, or are adopted into their forever home. It is important to remember that fostering should not be viewed as a 'trial' adoption. Anyone who fosters must be realistic about the expected outcome: that the animal will be adopted by another family.
