Dear Friends of LHS,

This year the Lakeshore Humane Society is celebrating 45 years of dedication to its mission. While fulfilling my duties as your president, I came across some interesting facts. I would like to take you back in time and get a snapshot of historic moments along this great journey.

October 8, 1970, a group of concerned women founded the Manitowoc County Humane Society, because they did not like the callous treatment stray and homeless dogs received. Their vision was to create a shelter to protect and care for these animals in a humane and compassionate manner. It was a huge undertaking that required careful planning and was completely supported by volunteers who secured our non-profit status, raised money to buy land, wrote by-laws, and created our mission:

Ensure the humane and compassionate treatment of all animals entrusted to its care

Reunite lost animals with their owners

Provide permanent homes for lost and abandoned companion animals

Extend humane education to the public

June 3, 1974, the organization purchased approximately 6 acres of land at the current location from the city of Manitowoc.

February 15, 1976, a modest 3000 square foot building was erected.

December 31, 1985, approximately 16,000 companion animals had passed through the new shelter doors since opening.

During 1985, 1627 animals passed through the shelter, of which:

*31% were placed in permanent homes
17% were reunited with their owners
52% were humanely euthanized*

LHS was able to make great progress towards fulfilling its mission, but the journey needed to continue.

March 16, 1990, Manitowoc County Humane Society, Inc changes name to **Lakeshore Humane Society, Inc.**

1996, Lakeshore Humane Society expands by 2000 square feet to a total of 5000 square feet at their current location of 1551 N. 8th street.

February, 2015, approximately over 60,000 companion animals have passed through the shelter doors since opening.

During 2014, 1510 animals passed through the shelter doors, of which:

*64% were placed in permanent homes
18% were reunited with their owners
8% were transferred to rescue organizations
7% were humanely euthanized
3% died*

As you can see, LHS has made significant progress towards fulfilling its mission, but the journey still needs to continue.

Thank you for being dedicated to the Lakeshore Humane Society mission and I look forward to having you as a part of journey into the future.



PUBLIC OUTREACH

Dogs Don't Bite "Out of the Blue."

Many bites can be prevented if people learn to read a dog's body language.



This dog's whole body is wagging calmly and he is panting. He is happy to see you.



He is not yawning because he is tired. He is anxious and he hopes you will leave him alone.



Her tail is high, her body is stiff and her mouth is closed. "I'm warning you. Back off!"



A tail tucked in, even if wagging a bit, means a very worried dog. "Please stay away from me."



The tongue flick and the slow, stiff tail wag tell you this dog is very unsure. "Go away."



This dog is turning her head away in order to avoid conflict. She doesn't want to be bothered.



The half-moon eye and the closed mouth tell you this dog is uncomfortable. "Leave me alone!"



The "freeze and stare" is a very dangerous sign! This dog will bite if you persist.




Wall of Love

HAPPY TAILS



As one of the Schleswig hoarder dogs, Bear was kept in inadequate space for years. The kennel in which she was forced to live was not large enough for her to stand up or sit upright in. This caused skeletal defects over time. She had a hunched appearance, and her back was bowed. Her tail had the appearance of an accordion as it too was restricted by space. Her body size was petite for a St. Bernard. One could assume that her growth was stunted due to many variables. She was not allowed out of her small confinement, she was not fed proper nutrition, nor was she even let out in the sunshine and fresh air for any period of time. Bear was missing hair on over 75% of her body. Bear was a prisoner not only in her own skin, but in the house and kennel where she was being kept. Bear was visibly depressed as her body language amply communicated that to us.

After being assessed medically, it was determined that Bear had a flea infestation which helped cause advanced skin dermatitis issues and hair loss. Bear had bilateral eye and ear infections, and also had a condition called cherry eye, or prolapse of the third eye glands. Her ear infections had caused scar tissue to build in her ears causing hearing loss. Bear had digestive issues that come with stress and poor nutrition, as well as in bad need of dental care.

A long term volunteer of the Lakeshore Humane Society named Carrie immediately connected with Bear as she remembered having a similar looking St. Bernard as a child. As soon as Bear

was processed at the shelter, she was released into foster care with Carrie. What Carrie did for Bear over the next few months was nothing short of amazing.

Once in Carrie's care, Bear never left her side. Bear was Carrie's shadow. Carrie often remarked that Bear would try to talk to her in low guttural moans and groans. Carrie didn't know if Bear's noises were lamentations, or if she was trying to tell Carrie that she was happy. Either way...Bear was communicating and coming out of her shell, and Carrie was there with her every step of the way to ensure her health and happiness.

Carrie was the most amazing foster parent to Bear. Carrie immediately educated herself on the mental and physical rehabilitation of dogs like Bear. Carrie created special meals for Bear that included hamburger, rice, and cottage cheese while her stomach was adjusting to her new life and diet. She took Bear for professional medicated baths as well as bathed her on a schedule at home with specialized shampoos. She took Bear for Reiki healing sessions, deep tissue pet massages, and canine hydrotherapy sessions donated at no cost for Bear at Liberty K9 Lodge in Green Bay to get her body and spirit back to health. Bear's hair started growing back in measurable quantities, and she was ready to be spayed.

It was troubling to Carrie that Bear did not know how to run. With all the freedom that Bear was enjoying now, Bear assumed the cramped positions that she was accustomed to in her captivity. Carrie would take Bear out for short walks. At first she would walk behind Carrie, not really sure of her surroundings or what she was supposed to be doing. In time and practice, Bear would start to explore beyond the shadow of Carrie and would walk with more confidence. These days, Bear is running! That is a special delight for Carrie to witness as it means that Bear is slowly forgetting the life she left behind in Schleswig, WI.

On November 16th, Carrie became a "foster failure" and adopted Bear. Presently, Bear lives a happy and healthy life with Carrie and her family that includes canine brothers! They all get along well, and Bear will have a forever place in her new permanent home. One of Bear's favorite places to be in her new home is in Carrie's bed. She keeps it warm for Carrie every day!


